HABIT: Terrestrial to aquatic perennial herb, scape to 8 dm.; flowering July to September

TOTAL RANGE: ME and Quebec to MN, s. to VA, TN, MO, and NE.

STATE RANGE (as of 2008): Post-1980 records are from Ashtabula, Erie, Geauga, Lucas, Ottawa, Pickaway, and Stark Counties. Pre-1980 records are from Cuyahoga, Lake, Licking, Lorain, Medina, Muskingum, Perry, Pike, Portage, Ross, and Sandusky.

HABITAT: Shallow water and shores of ponds, marshes, ditches, and canals. Most of the recent records are from counties bordering Lake Erie, and the old Ohio and Erie Canal.

HAZARDS: Drainage or other alteration causing excessive drying of the wetland habitat.

RECOVERY POTENTIAL: Unknown, but possibly good due to its variety of habitat.

INVENTORY GUIDELINES: Mature flowering or fruiting material is needed for positive identification.

COMMENTS: Certainly destruction of wetland habitat, and possibly other unknown factors, has caused a considerable decline in the abundance of *Sagittaria rigida* in Ohio.
